## MEETING CRITICAL COMMUNITY NEEDS

## EARLY ACCESS LANDLORD-TENANT MEDIATION

Thanks to the support of the Hawaii Justice Foundation and the Friends of Hawaii Charities, MCP launched an Early Access Landlord-Tenant Mediation (EAM) Program at the start of 2017. Last fiscal year, MCP mediated 395 landlord-tenant cases at court. By then it is often too late, and many tenants end up being evicted. Therefore, MCP is encouraging landlords and tenants to mediate early, before going to court.

For the past nine months, MCP has been laying the foundation for the EAM Program by: creating a speakers bureau; contacting businesses, Rotary Clubs and churches to inform them about EAM and to seek their participation in providing mediation services within their community; conducting presentations for property management companies, non-profit and government agencies working with tenants; and developing working relationships with other organizations involved with tenants and the newly housed homeless, including Catholic Charities, Partners in Care, the Veterans Task Force and more.

MCP is grateful to Ned Busch, Cecelia Chang and Gary Shiraishi for assisting with outreach. Thanks to their efforts, the seeds for encouraging landlords and tenants to access mediation early through MCP have been planted and the awareness about EAM is slowly growing. Through continued work, more landlords and tenants will use mediation in the future to work out their differences early and prevent evictions.


## KUPUNA PONO

The Kupuna Pono Program (KPP) is one of the many critical services provided by MCP. KPP addresses the prevention and resolution of family conflicts involving the care of an elder family member. Caregiving can be extremely stressful, resulting in healthcare problems for the caregiver as well as potential abuse of the elder. Studies show that family conflict is generally a component of the caregiving experience. Conflicts result in poorer physical and mental health of the caregiver, as well as reduced quality of care for the elder family member. KPP provides elders and their families with mediation to resolve conflicts, as well as a family conferencing process to prevent conflict and create a shared caregiving experience that reduces the burden on the primary caregiver and more effectively meet the needs and desires of the elder person.

Thanks to the Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation and the Charles H. Hurd Memorial Fund for Kupuna Pono, over the past three years KPP has steadily grown. 131 cases involving families with elder members ranging from 65 to 101 were managed. $75 \%$ of the KPP cases involved individuals in the low-income population. $94 \%$ of the elder mediations and family conferences conducted resulted in a written agreement or family plan. As a result of these outcomes families stopped fighting, stress was reduced, the elder family member received support to remain in their home and caregiver responsibilities were shared, reducing the burden on the primary caregiver.

MCP is grateful to Charles "Chuck" Hurd whose passion and vision lead to the development of KPP, to the Harry \& Jeanette Weinberg Foundation whose three-year grant enabled MCP to take KPP to the next level and to all of the mediators and facilitators who worked with the many families and their elders to develop caregiving plans, as well as helped with outreach and the promotion of KPP. Through continued efforts, more families will have the opportunity to engage in difficult conversations through KPP.
